

ORDINANCE NO. 957.

WHEREAS, the trees and shrubbery in the parks, streets and avenues in the Village of Bexley are becoming diseased and require attention, and


WHEREAS, it will be necessary to get expert advice as to the treatment and care of said trees and shrubbery and that it is desired that a survey thereof be made by an expert for the guidance of Council in determining what shall be done in the way of such treatment and care, NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:


Section 1. That H. M. Hansen Jr. be, and he is hereby employed to make a survey of the trees and shrubbery located within the parks, other than Commonwealth Commons, and in the streets and avenues in the Village, and that he make report thereof to this council with his recommendations as to future care and treatment of said trees and shrubbery and of his recommendations, if any, as to future planting of trees and shrubbery; and that he be paid therefore the sum of \$1.50 per hour but not to exceed the total sum of \$125.00, which sum is hereby appropriated for said purpose from the Park Fund.

Section 2. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance and is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and shall go into immediate force and effect.
