

AN ORDINANCE NO. 1001.

To create the position and provide for the appointment of a forester in the Village of Bexley, Ohio.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the mayor may with the consent of council appoint a forester in the Village of Bexley, whose duties it shall be to inspect the trees and shrubberies in the parks, streets and avenues in the Village, superintend and supervise the trimming and shaping thereof, and the removal of the dead wood, broken branches, stubs, crossing, rubbing and interferring branches therefrom.

Section 2. Said appointment shall be at the pleasure of the mayor, but shall not exceed the period of six (6) months in any one year, and the salary shall not exceed Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per month during the term of service.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance and is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and shall go into immediate force and effect.
