AN ORDINANCE NO. 1007.

Authorizing the borrowing of money and the issuing of motes of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, in anticipation of the levy of special assessments for the improvement of Pleasant Ridge Avenue from Mound Street to Main Street.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Village of Bexley, Ohio, be and hereby is, authorized to borrow money in the sum of Thirteen Thousand, Seven Hundred Dollars (\$13,700.00), and to issue the notes of said Village therefor in anticipation of the levy of special assessments and of the issue of bonds in anticipation of the collection of said assessments as provided by Section 2293-24 of the General Code of Ohio, to pay that part of the cost heretofore determined to be specially assessed for the improvement of Pleasant Ridge Avenue from Mound Street to Main Street in said Village, by grading, curbing and paving the roadway thereof with brick, asphalt, concrete or some other form of permanent improvement, constructing the necessary sewers or drains to furnish proper drainage for such improvement, installing water taps and necessary sanitary sewer taps, constructing sidewalks on both sides thereof and electing street signs, as provided by Resolution No. 766, declaring the necessity therefor, adopted March 12th, 1929, and in pursuance of an Ordinance No. 1003, determining to proceed with said improvement, passed April 23rd, 1929.

payment of said bonds and the interest thereon. Said notes shall be the full general obligation of the Village and the full faith and revenue of the Village are hereby pledged for the payment of the same and for the levy of assessments for said improvement and for the issue of bonds in anticipation of the collection of such assessments. In the event that said assessments are not levied or bonds are not issued to provide a fund for the payment of such notes at maturity, a general tax shall be levied against all interest thereon.

Section 3. That the Finance Committee of this Council shall cause said notes to be properly prepared, executed and sold according to law; the same shall first be offered to the trustees of the Sinking Fund of the Village at par and accrued interest and any notes not purchased by said trustees shall be sold at private sale to the person, persons, company or corporations offering the best price therefor, but shall not be sold for less than par and accrued interest and shall deposit the proceeds in the Village Treasury to the credit of Pleasant Ridge Avenue Improvement Fund.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by haw.
