

AN ORDINANCE NO. 1008.

To narrow Charles Street to the width of Forty feet from College Avenue to Sheridan Avenue.

WHEREAS, on the 16th day of April, 1929, a petition by the owners of all the lots and lands abutting on Charles Street between College Avenue and Sheridan Avenue, was duly presented to Council praying that said street, between College And Sheridan Avenues be narrowed by vacating ten feet (10') off of each side thereof, and


WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Council of the Village of Bexley, there is good cause for narrowing Charles Street in said Village to a width of forty feet from College Avenue to Sheridan Avenue; and that it will not be detrimental to the general interest to vacate a strip ten feet (10') in width off of each side of said Street for the purpose of narrowing the same as aforesaid.


NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley and State of Ohio:

Section 1. That a strip of ground ten feet in width off of each side of Charles Street from College Avenue to Sheridan Avenue, be, and the same hereby is, vacated, and that said Street be, and the same hereby is, narrowed from sixty feet to forty feet in width between the point aforesaid.

Section 2. That this ordinance be and remain in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
