

AN ORDINANCE NO. 1014.

To regulate the screening of front porches extending beyond set back line.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That no open porch extending beyond the set back line provided by the zoning ordinance of the Village of Bexley, being Ordinance No. 456, passed on the 23rd day of October, 1923 shall be enclosed with screens without the owner first obtaining a permit so to do from the Building Department of the Village of Bexley.

Section 2. In screening such porches such screens must be so installed as to be easily removable; there shall be no provision for or attempt to substitute glass in lieu of said screens; when said screens are removed there shall be no objectionable columns or braces remaining, and such screens shall extend from the top of said porch to a point not more than thirty inches above the floor of said porch.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
