

AN ORDINANCE NO. 1027.

Providing for entering into an agreement with the City of Columbus, Ohio for the discharge into the sewer system of the City of Columbus, Ohio of sewage from the Village of Bexley, Ohio.
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Clerk be and hereby are authorized and directed to enter into a contract on behalf of the Village of Bexley with the City of Columbus, Ohio providing for the discharge from said Village of sanitary sewage into the intercepting sewer; south of Livingston Avenue and west of Alum Creek, and subject to the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

(a) The construction of all sewers and connections in said Village, including connection with the city sewer, shall be at the entire expense of said Village and shall be equal in all respects to the grade of sewer work done by the city. Plans and specifications shall be satisfactory to the city engineer.

(b) No right shall be granted to any party or premises, outside the said village, to discharge sewage into the sewers constructed by the Village of Bexley unless permission is given by the city engineer and proper legal agreements are executed and filed for and on behalf of such new parties or new premises. Any premises located within said village may be connected into such sewers on the filing of a notice with the city engineer that such connection is to be made.

(c) The city shall have the right to disconnect the sewer from said village or from any property therein if the charges herein provided for are not paid within 60 days after the same shall become due.

(d) For each calendar year or part thereof the rate of charge to be paid by the Village of Bexley to the City of Columbus, for residences connected with such sewers, payable on or before February 1st of the following year, shall be as follows: for single houses, \$4.00; for double houses, \$3.50, for each side; for apartment houses, \$3.00 for each apartment; provided, however, that said rates shall remain in force and effect only until such time as the cost to the city of disposing of said sewage may be ascertained, at which time the city reserves the right to increase or decrease said rates.

(e) The annual charge for stores, factories and other business houses connected with such sewers, to be paid by the Village of Bexley, shall be \$1.00 for each and every person employed or engaged in service on such premises, payable on or before February 1st of the following year, the number of such persons to be determined by the average number employed for the year.


(f) Said Village shall therein agree to keep and maintain an accurate record of all premises within the corporate limits connected with said sewer, and shall collect from the owners of such premises all charges for the use of sewers or otherwise provide for such charges, and shall pay, as above set forth, the amount stated for each and every building or premises connected with said sewer, to the City of

Columbus; the amount payable shall be paid in a single payment, and shall be accompanied by a statement showing in detail the premises connected for which payment is made.

(g) No trade waste of any sort or surface water shall be discharged into the sewer system of the city without permission granted by special contract approved by the council of the City of Columbus.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
