

## AN ORDINANCE NO. 1049.

Reducing special assessment for improving Grandon Avenue, on Lot No. 183, Eastlawn Addition, belonging to A. W. Bartholomew.

Whereas, by Ordinance No. 898, passed January 10th, 1928, there was assessed upon Lot No. 183, Eastlawn Addition, belonging to A. W. Bartholomew, for the improvement of Grandon Avenue, the sum of \$189.23 which amount bears interest from February 1st, 1928 at  $4\frac{1}{2}\%$ , and

Whereas, there was by mistake included in said assessment the sum of \$36.00 for water tap, which tap was not installed, and, whereas, the Council is of the opinion that said assessment should be reduced by said sum of \$36.00 to correct said error, NOW, THEREFORE:


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That there be and is hereby remitted from said assessment of \$189.23 against said Lot No. 183 of Eastlawn Addition, belonging to A. W. Bartholomew, for the improvement of Grandon Avenue, as levied and assessed in said Ordinance No. 898, the sum of \$36.00 with interest at  $4\frac{1}{2}\%$  from February 1st, 1928, and that the Auditor of Franklin County, Ohio, be and hereby is authorized to deduct from the unpaid installments of said assessment upon his records said sum of \$36.00 with interest as aforesaid, for the purpose of correcting said over assessment.

Section 2. That the Clerk be and is hereby authorized to certify a copy of this ordinance to the Auditor of Franklin County, Ohio.


Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
