

ORDINANCE NO. 13-31

By Mr. F. Bonnet.

To levy special assessments for the construction of a system of lighting for Astor Avenue, between College Avenue and Pleasant Ridge Avenue.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the assessment of the cost and expense of constructing a system of lighting for Astor Avenue, between College Avenue and Pleasant Ridge Avenue, pursuant to and in accordance with an Ordinance No. 1050, determining to proceed with said improvement, passed April 1st, 1930, in the aggregate amount of \$950.00, as reported to this council on the 23rd day of December, 1930, by the board heretofore appointed to estimate said assessments, notice of the filing of which assessments has been given as required by law, be and the same is hereby adopted and confirmed, and that there be and is hereby levied and assessed upon the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said improvement, the several amounts reported as aforesaid, which said assessments, together with the description of said lots and lands are as follows, to-wit:

And it is hereby determined and declared by this council that said lots and lands are each benefited by said improvement in an amount equal to the assessment hereby levied thereon and that said assessments are in proportion to the special benefits.

Section 2. That the total assessment against each lot or parcel of land shall be payable in cash within thirty days from ~~and~~ after the passage of this ordinance, or, at the option of the owner, in five annual installments, with interest thereon from the 1st day

of March, 1931, at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be issued in anticipation of the collection of the same, to-wit: the rate of _____ per centum per annum. All cash payments shall be made to the Treasurer of said City. All assessments and installments thereof remaining unpaid at the expiration of said thirty days shall be certified by the clerk to this council to the Auditor of Franklin County, Ohio, as provided by law, to be by him placed on the tax duplicate and collected as other taxes are collected.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Notice of Assessments for Various Improvements in Bexley, Ohio.
Notice is hereby given that the estimated assessment of the cost of constructing a water line in Westland Avenue, between Park Hill Drive and a point 90 ft. south of the south line of Harriett H. Richards property; and of constructing water mains in Elm Avenue, from Roosevelt Avenue to Gould Road; Dale Avenue, from valve at east side of Stanwood Road to valve at west side of Roosevelt Avenue and from valve at east side of Roosevelt Avenue to Gould Road; Plymouth Avenue, from Merkle Road from south line of Lot 285, Bexley Highlands Amended, to Elm Avenue; Fair Avenue, from Roosevelt Avenue to east line of Lot 156, Bexley Highlands Amended; Brentwood Road, from Remington Road to Gould Road; Sherwood Road, from Remington Road to Gould Road; north side of Main Street, from Remington Road to Gould Road; Roosevelt Avenue, from north line of Main Street to the north line of Bryden Road and from the south line of Bexley Park Road to the north line of Park Road to the valve at the south side of Fair Avenue; constructing water mains in Gould Road and north side of Main Street and Maryland Avenue; paving Bryden Road from Drexel Avenue to Cassady Road; Remington Road to Gould Road; constructing sanitary sewers in part of Sanitary District No. 5, between Main Street and Maryland Ave; and installing ornamental street lights on Astor Avenue, between College Avenue and Pleasant Ridge Avenue; on the lots and lands benefited and to be charged therewith, as set forth in resolutions providing for such construction, has been made and reported to the council and said estimated assessments are now on file in the office of the Clerk, Bexley, Ohio, for inspection and examination by all persons interested therein. Objections to said assessments shall be filed in writing with the clerk within the time prescribed by law.
