ORDINANCE NO. 13-33

By Mr. Pretzman.

To authorize the payment of the claim of Edward T. Phillips.

Whereas, on or about the 23rd day of December, 1933, Edward T. Phillips was walking west on the north sidewalk of East Main Street at the entrance to the Municipal Building of the City of Bexley during the hours of darkness, and was struck by the automobile used as a police cruiser and owned by the City of Bexley, which was then being driven by one of the policemen of the City, causing a fracture of the third meta tarsul bone of the right foot, and

whereas, the said Edward T. Phillips, through no negligence of his own, has suffered damages to his person and by way of loss of time from his work, by reason of the aforesaid accident in the reasonable sum of \$115.00, NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the claim of Edward T. Phillips in the sum of \$115.00 for damages to his person sustained on or about the 23rd day of December, 1932, as hereinabove set forth, be and the same is recognized as a moral obligation of the City of Bexley.

Section 2. That for the purpose of paying said claim there be and hereby is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$115.00.

Phillips has executed his release to the City of Bexley from all damages arising out of said accident, upon the payment of said sum of \$115.00, and as therein directed, that said payment be made in two vouchers, the one thereof in the sum of \$25.00 made payable to Dr. R. E. Ramey to cover medical services rendered to the said Phillips in the treatment of said injuries, the other in the sum of \$90.00 to be issued to Charles B. Cranston, attorney for Edward T. Phillips. The proper officials of the City are hereby authorized to issue their vouchers in said amounts to said

named persons in full of all damages arising out of said accident.

Section 4. That said ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
