Fixing locations for planting of trees on Broad Street in the City of Bexley, Ohio.

Whereas, the improvement of Broad Street from the east corporation line to the west corporation line is about to be completed, which improvement leaves a grass plot or parkway between the curbs and the sidewalks as constructed, or as established, of the width of approximately 18 feet, which parkways will be from time to time beautified by the planting of shade trees therein by either the City or private property owners, and

whereas, it will greatly contribute to the beauty of said street and will be to the public interest that such trees when planted shall be of one variety and shall be located at a uniform distance insofar as practicable from the sidewalk line, and

Whereas, the Street Committee after careful consideration has recommended to council that all such plantings be American White Elms and that the same be planted 6 feet from the edge of the sidewalk nearest the curb, and that same be planted 50 feet apart, making due allowance for locations of intersecting streets and drives, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

by the City or by private property owners in Broad Street in the City of Bexley, the same shall be limited to the variety known as American White Elm, and shall be planted in the parkway between the curb and the sidewalk, or space reserved for sidewalk, 6 feet distant from the edge of the sidewalk nearest the curb. In the event that sidewalks shall not have been constructed opposite such place of planting, then such trees shall be located 6 feet from the space so reserved for sidewalks.

Such trees shall be located approximately 50 feet apart, making due allowance for intersecting streets and drives. The location for all plantings of such trees shall be obtained from the Superintendent of Parks, and such planting shall be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Parks.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law. Passed October 10th, 1933.
