BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF CHIO:

Section 1. That there be and is hereby appropriated from the Streets, Maintenance and Repair, Gasoline Tax Fund, the sum of \$2,500.00 to pay that portion of the cost of necessary materials and incidental miscellaneous expenses which are to be borne by the City of Bexley in the following relief project under Civil Works Program, to-wit: The improvement of Remington Road from Main Street to the south line of the property of the Board of Education of the Bexley City School District by grading, draining and paving the roadway thereof with reenforced concrete, with concrete curbs and gutters and concrete sidewalks, in accordance with the plans, profiles, specifications and estimates heretofore prepared by the engineers and on file in the office of the Mayor.

Section 2. That this ordinance is an emergency ordinance and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that large numbers of citizens are unemployed and it is necessary that said project be gotten under way without delay, for which reason said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
