To vacate that portion of Dale Avenue, alley east of Cassingham Road, and a portion of Remington Road, extending through the property of the Board of Education of the Bexley School District.

Whereas, on the 25 rd. day of October, 1954, a petition and written consent by the Board of Education of the Bexley City Chool District, being the owner of all the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the following streets and alleys, to-wit:

1. Being that portion of Dale Avenue shown on the plat of Rudolph's Fairwood Addition which lies east of Cassingham Road.

BE IT ORDLINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEHLEY, STATE OF CHIO:

Section 1. That the following streets and alleys,

1. Being that portion of Dale Avenue shown on the plat of Rudolph's Pairwood Addition which lies east of Cassingham Road.

2. The alley in the rear of the lots facing on the east side of Cassingham Road in Bexley Place and in Rucolph's Fairwood Addition south of Elm Avenue.

5. That part of Remington Road extending through Bexley Place Addition, and any right which may be or lie in the public and the City of Bexley in the easement along the east line of lots 2, 5, 4 and 5 of Rudolph's Heir's partition, which easement was never dedicated to public use, but was for the benefit of these lots in the Rudolph's Heir's Partition,

be and the same are hereby vacated.

Dection 2, That a copy of this ordinance be certified to the Auditor of Franklin County, Chio.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
