#### ORDINANCE NO. 38-34.

By Mr. Altmaier.

To fix the prices to be charged by The Columbus nailway, Power and Light Company, its successors and assigns, for electric current in the City of Bexley, Ohio, during the period of five years from the effective date of this ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the City of Bexley, Franklin County, Ohio:

Section 1. That for the period of five (5) years from and after the effective date of this ordinance, the rates and prices which The Columbus Railway, Power and Light Company, its successors and assigns, shall be entitled to charge for electric current furnished to consumers in the City of Bexley, Franklin County, Ohio, are hereby fixed at not to exceed the following:

#### ALTERNATING ELECTRIC CURRENT POWER SERVICE.

A minimum monthly charge of One Dollar Twenty-five Cents per kilowatt, or fraction thereof, of maximum capacity required by the consumer, plus the following kilowatt- hour charges for energy crisumed.

First 10,000 Kilowatt-hours per month at----la Cents per K. W. H. All over 10,000 Kilowatt-hours per month at----0.9 ents per K. W. H.

Discount of Five (5) Ber Cent upon all bills paid when due.

OPTIONAL OFF PEAK HIGH LOAD FACTOR POWER RATE ALTERNATING ELECTRIC CURRENT POWER SERVICE.

A mimimum monthly charge of One Dollar and Twenty-five Cents per kilowatt, or fraction thereof, of maximum capacity required by the consumer, plus the following kilowatt-hour charges in each consumed.

HIGH LOAD FACTOR AND POWER FACTOR COULD FOR YING RATE DURING OFF\*PEAK SEASON.

OfT-peak season: March 1st to October 316%

High load factor- A credit of 0.25 cent per kalowatt hour shall be given on all energy used monthly in excess of 300 hours use of the maximum demand, as adjusted for power factor, beginning with the month of March and continuing through the month of October each year.

Power factor- The Maximum demand in each month of the off-peak season shall be increased one per cent for each one per cent by which the average lagging power factor falls below 80 per cent, and decreased one per cent for each one per cent by which the average lagging power factor is above 80 per cent, except that no adjustment shall be made when the average lagging power factor is between 75 per cent and 85 per cent; and the maximum demand shall not in an case be reduced more than 20 per cent.

Discount of Five Per Cent upon all bills pass when due.

#### PRIMARY ELECTRIC POWER SERVICE.

The comsumer shall furnish, install, operate and maintain a suitable sub-station, consisting of transformers, voltage regulating equipment, oil switches and all other suipment and appurtenances that may be required for safe operation. All in accordance with specifications and requirements of the National Slectric Code.

A minimum monthly charge of One Design and Twentyfive Cents per kilowatt of maximum capacity required by the consumer for the first one thousand kilowatts and One Dollar for each kilowatt in excess of one thousand kilowatts, plus the following kilowatt-hour charges for energy comsumed.

# OPTIONAL OFF PEAK HIGH LOAD FACTOR POWER RATE PRIMARY ELECTRIC CURRENT POWER SERVICE.

The consumer shall furnish, install, operate and maintain a suitable sub-station, consisting of transformers, voltage regulating equipment, oil switches and all other equipment and appurtanences that may be rquired for safe operation. All in accordance with specifications and requirements of the National Electrical Cole.

A mimimum monthly charge of One Dollar and Twenty-five Cents per kilowatt, or fraction thereof, of maximum capacity required by the consumer for the first one thousand kilowatts and One Dollar for each kilowatt in excess of one thousand kilowatts, plus the following kilowatt-hour charges for energy consumed:

First 10,000 Kilowatt-hours per month at----12 Cents per K. W. H. All over 10,000 Kilowatt-hours per month at----0.85 Cents per K. W. H.

Discount of Five Per Cent upon all bills paid when due.

HIGH LOAD FACTOR AND POWER FACTOR CONDITIONS MODIFYING RATE DURING OFF\*PEAK SEASON.

Off-peak season: March 1st to October31st.

High load factor- A credit of 0.25 Cents per Kilowatt-hour shall be given on all energy used monthly in excess of 300 hours use of the maximum demand, as adjusted for power factor, beginning with the month of March and continuing through the month of Ostober each year.

Power factor- The maximum demand in each month of the offpeak season shall be increased one per cent for each one per cent
by which the average lagging power factor falls below 80 per cent,
and decreased one per cent for each one per cent by which the
average lagging power factor is above 80 per cent, except that no
adjustment shall be made when the average lagging power factor is
between 75 per cent and 85 per cent; and the maximum demand shall
not in any case be reduced more than 20 per cent.

and that, except as hereinafter provided, no additional or extra charge or charges shall be made for such service.

Section 2. That if in any semi-annual period, beginning on January 1 and July 1, respectively, of each year of this ordinance period, the unit cost to the Company per kilowatt hour of total energy sold, on account of (a) taxes and other public charges, whether federal, state, municipal or otherwise, (b) fuel, and (c) wages (exclusive of salaries of administrative officers, as defined by The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio's classification) shall be less or greater than such unit cost for the year 1934 by as much as five per cent (5%), the Company shall, in the event of such decrease, for thwith notify the City of the same and thereupon deduct from all bills rendered by it in the ensuing six (6) months' peried a discount of four tembes of one (1) per cent (0.4%) for each one per cent (1%) of such decrease; and may, in the event of such increase, add to the all bills randered by it in the six (6) months' period ensuing after the expiration of the notice hereinafter provided for, a surcharge of four tenths of one (1) per cent (0.4%) for each one per cent (1%) of such increase.

The foregoing shall be effective and binding upon said City and said Company, its successors and asigns, whether such change in such unit cost be due to variations in total expenditures for said items (a), (b) and (c), or to variations in the total number of kilowatt hours of energy seld, or to both.

In the event of such increase or decrease, said Company shall file with the City Auditor-Clerk, at the end of each semi-annual period first above mentioned, a sworn itemized statement setting forth the facts and figures justifying such increase or decrease. The City shall also have the right at any and all times to examine and inspect all vouchers, accounts, records and other data of said Company relating to such taxes and other public charges, fuel, wages and energy sales; and no such increase shall be made unless and until said Company shall have given to the City not less than thirty (30) days' notice in writing of its intention to make the same effective.

Section 3. The this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after thirty-one days from its passage, towit, from and after the 11th day of January, 1935, and shall remain in effect for the period of five years thereafter, pro-wided it shall have been assemted to by said Company by written acceptance filed in the office of the City Auditor-Clerk of said City on or before fifteen days after its passage.
