

## ORDINANCE NO. 27-35

By Mr. Stackhouse.

Authorizing payment of bill of Charles F. Long, Consulting Chemical Engineer.

Whereas, Charles F. Long, Consulting Chemical Engineer, was employed by Council to perform professional services in connection with the cases pending against the City growing out of the pollution of Alum Creek, said services consisting of taking samples and making analysis, and reports thereon, and preparation for trial of said cases, for which he has submitted a bill in the sum of \$250.00, NOW, THEREFORE,  
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Council hereby finds that said services of Charles F. Long were necessary in the preparation of said cases now pending in the Common Pleas Court, and that same were reasonably of the value of said bill and, therefore, allows the same and directs the payment thereof.

Section 2. That the sum of \$250.00 is hereby appropriated from General Fund for the payment thereof.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
