

ORDINANCE NO. 34-55.

By Mr. S. J. Altmaier.

Providing for the construction of storm sewers in various streets in Bellwood Addition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That council has determined and hereby does determine that it is necessary to construct storm sewers in Columbus Street, Bellwood Avenue and Delmar Drive, each from Cassady Avenue east to the east line of Bellwood Addition, and that it hereby determines to proceed with said improvement all in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles prepared by the engineers and on file in the office of the Mayor, which are hereby approved.

Section 2. That whereas, the Works Progress Administration of the Public Works of the United States has proposed and agreed to furnish all labor in the making of said improvements and a great portion of the materials necessary therefor, and to make and perform said improvements on condition that the City of Bexley shall furnish the balance of said materials and the engineering services, said balance of materials being in the estimated amount of \$300.00, said improvements shall be made in accordance with said proposal and agreement and the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase of said materials according to the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles hereinabove referred to.

Section 3. That the sum of \$500.00 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund for the payment of the cost of said materials.

Section 4. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that the district served by said improvements are now without adequate storm sewerage, for which reason said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
