

ORDINANCE NO. 26-36.

Providing for repair and maintenance of alleys in the City of Bexley by application of oil to surface thereof.

Whereas, certain alleys in the City of Bexley are bearing heavy burdens of traffic, and the proper repair and maintenance thereof require that the surface of such alleys be treated with oil so as to prevent the annoyance of dust in the vicinity thereof, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract for the purchase, or for the purchase and application, of the necessary oil for the treatment of such alleys within the City as shall in the opinion of the Mayor require such treatment.

Section 2. That the sum of \$450.00 is hereby appropriated from the Maintenance and Repair of Streets Gasoline Tax Fund for the cost thereof.

Section 3. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
