

ORDINANCE NO. 29-36.

Providing for a Justice of the Peace for the Township of Bexley and the election thereof.

Whereas, on the 12th day of August, 1936, by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, duly adopted that part of Marion township included within the corporate limits of the City of Bexley was created into a new township under the name of Bexley Township, and

Whereas, on the 31st day of August, 1936, the Court of Common Pleas of Franklin County, Ohio, in accordance with the statute made and provided fixed as one justice of the peace the number of justices for such township and set the day for the election thereof on November 3rd, 1936, and

Whereas, it is a requirement of law that such township have at least one justice of the peace, NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That there shall be one justice of the peace in said Bexley Township elected on the 3rd day of November, 1936, in accordance with said order of the Common Pleas Court to serve to and including December 31st, 1937, and that at the regular election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1937, and quadrennially thereafter, one justice of the peace for said township shall be elected for a term of four years commencing on the 1st day of January next following his election.

Section 2. Before entering upon the discharge of his duties the Justice of the Peace shall give bond to the state in the sum of \$1,000.00 with sureties and conditioned according to law.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
