ORDINANCE NO. 36-36.

By Mr. Altmaier.

To prevent intoxication in the city of Bexley, Ohio.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Whoever is found in a state of intoxication or whoever, being intoxicated, shall disturb the peace and good order, or shall conduct himself in a disorderly manner, shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00.

Section 2. That Ordinance No. 4, passed October 13th, 1908, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
