

ORDINANCE NO. 48-36:

By Mr. Sam'l. Betz.

Providing for the marking of streets and procuring and placing of traffic signs in the City of Bexley, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to mark or cause to be marked or lines, the streets in the City of Bexley for the purpose of traffic regulation, and to enter into a contract, after advertisement according to law, for the purchase of the necessary signs, markings and devices, and to have the same placed or erected upon the streets and highways of the City, as provided for in Ordinance No. 47-36, establishing a traffic code for the City of Bexley.

Section 2. That the sum of \$1,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the Street Maintenance and Repair Fund for the payment of the foregoing costs and expenses.


Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and the same shall go into immediate force and effect.


