ORDINANCE NO. 7-37

Authorizing purchase of automobile sedan for the Safety Department, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they hereby are authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase of one automobile, being a two door Sedan, with Standard equipment, but to have two windshield wipers, and a heavy duty generator adaptable to police cruiser work, and spare wheel, same not to exceed \$750.00, in price, and to exchange thereon one 1935 Master Chevrolet Coach, Engine No. 5452515, with all equipment thereon excepting spot light, radio, siren, fire extinguisher, rlasher signal, heater and defroster, or bid may call for new heater and defroster. The seller shall transfer all of the above equipment except the radio, which shall be taken care of by the City to the new car, same to be included in bid; provided that if the successful bid calls for new heater and defroster, said old heater and defroster shall be left on the old car.

Section 2. Said contract shall be entered into with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement had according to law. The sum of \$750.00 is hereby appropriated from General Fund for the purpose aforesaid.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that the Safety Department is in immediate need of said automobile for street patroling purposes, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect
