Determining to proceed with the construction and installation of a system of lighting for Bryden Road, between Remington Road and Gould Road, and Bexley Park Road, between Remington Road and Gould Road, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY? STATE OF OHIO:
Three-fourths of all members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the construction and installation of a system of lighting for Bryden Road, between Remington Road and Gould Road, and Bexley Park Road, between Remington Road and Gould Road, in the City of Bexley, Ohio, by laying underground cables, execting light standards, installing lamps, conduits, and other necessary equipment, in pursuance of a Resolution No. 5-37, declaring it necessary to provide for lighting said streets, adopted on the 13th day of July, 1937, and in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles for said system of lighting, now on file in the office of the Mayor, which are hereby approved.

Section 2. That all claims for damages resulting from the construction and installation of said lighting system shall be judicially inquired into after the completion thereof, and that the solicitor be and hereby is authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of Competent Jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That the entire cost of constructing and installing said system for lighting said streets shall be specially assessed in propertion to the benefits which may result from said improvements on all the lots and lands bounding, fronting and abutting upon said proposed improvement between the points aforesaid, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement, and in an amount equal to that part of the cost thereof hereby determined to be assessed thereon.

Section 4. That the special assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five substantially equal annual installments with interest on the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be hereafter issued in anticipation of the collection of said

assessments.

Section 5. That money shall be borrowed and the notes of said City issued therefor in an amount not to exceed the estimated cost of said improvement due and payable not later than two years from the date of issue, in anticipation of the levy of said special assessments, and of the issuance of bonds in anticipation of the collection of said special assessments.

Section 6. That bonds of said City shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of said special assessments, in an amount sufficient to pay that portion of the estimated cost of said improvement for which said assessments are levied.

Section 7. That the Auditor of the City be and he hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction and installation of said system of lighting, in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said abutting properties are without adequate lighting facilities, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
