

ORDINANCE NO. 36-37

By Mr. Betz--

To prohibit soliciting to the annoyance of others  
in the City of Bexley, and providing punishment therefor.  
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY,  
STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Whoever, being engaged in soliciting  
upon the premises of another in the City of Bexley for the  
sale of any articles, goods or merchandise, or for the  
subscription to any books, magazines or other literature,  
disturbs or annoys the occupant or occupants of said  
premises, or who gains admittance to said premises other  
than by the consent or invitation of the occupant or occupants  
thereof, or who refuses to leave said premises upon the  
request of such occupant or occupants, shall be guilty of  
a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined  
not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more than Twenty-  
five Dollars (\$25.00), and shall pay the costs of prosecu-  
tion.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be  
in force from and after the earliest period allowed by  
law.
