ORDINANCE NO. 8-38

Authorizing purchase of automobile sedan for the Safety Department, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they hereby are authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase of one automobile, being a two door sedan, with standard equipment, two windshield wipers, heavy duty air cooled generator adaptable to police cruiser work, and heavy duty battery sufficient for radio and other equipment, spare wheel, heater, spotlight, and rear compartment, or trunk space, sufficient to provide space for Red Cross equipment and blankets, but not to have free wheeling or knee action; the cost thereof not to exceed \$950.00; and to exchange thereon one 1937 Chevrolet Master Coach, Factory Number 9GB 12-5736, Motor Number 263860, together with all equipment thereon, excepting the siren and radio, which shall be transferred to the new car, and in the event that said heavy duty air cooled generator in said coach can be transferred to the new automobile, then the same shall be done and no such generator purchased with the new car, said transfers, excepting said radio, to be made by the seller to the automobile so to be purchased. Bids may also be taken for . said automobile with new redio, in which event the radio in said coach shall remain thereis.

Section 2. Said contract shall be entered into with the lowest and best bidder after adventisement had according to law. The sum of \$950.00 is hereby a copriated from the general fund for the purpose afore...

Section 3. This or mergency measure,

necessary for the immediate of the public peace,

health and safety, said even that the Safety Department is in immediate need of said automobile, and said ordinance

shall go into immediate force and effect.
