

ORDINANCE NO. 14-38

By Mr. Kenna Boeshaar:-

Providing for the improvement of Merkle Road from Broad Street to the north end thereof, in cooperation with the Works Progress Administration, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO: Three-fourths of all members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. That Council has determined and hereby does determine that it is necessary to improve Merkle Road from Broad Street to the north end thereof by grading, draining, paving the roadway thereof with waterbound macadam base and two inch black surface top, constructing concrete curbs and gutters, installing water mains and sanitary and storm sewers with necessary water and sewer connections, and that it hereby determines to proceed with said improvement, all in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles prepared by the engineers and on file in the office of the Mayor, which are hereby approved.

Section 2. Whereas, the Works Progress Administration of the Public Works of the United States has proposed and agreed to furnish all labor in the making of said improvement, and a portion of the materials necessary therefor, and to make and perform said improvement on condition that the City of Bexley shall furnish the balance of said materials and equipment and other direct costs, including engineering services, in accordance with the Works Progress Administration Form No. 301, now on file with the Mayor, and whereas, J. L. Davis, being the owner of certain premises located on said Merkle Road hereinabove described, on behalf of himself and other owners of premises fronting and abutting thereon, has heretofore paid the Jennings-Lawrence Company the sum of \$400.00 for the preparation of the necessary plans, specifications, and has paid to and deposited with the Auditor of City of Bexley further estimates and profiles for said improvement, sum of \$7,100.00, under his agreement on behalf of himself and said other property owners that the same shall be applied by the City of Bexley to pay its portion of the cost of said improvement, and, however,

the cost of the necessary water service lines, which service lines shall be paid in full by the City of Bexley, and a service charge therefor shall be made to the individual owners at the time they shall connect therewith, and which said sum of \$7,100.00 has been deposited by said Auditor to the credit of the general fund of the City, Now, Therefore, Council does ordain that said improvement shall be made in accordance with said proposal and agreement, and the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase of said materials according to the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles hereinabove referred to after advertisement had according to law, and said Works Progress Administration is hereby authorized to enter upon said street and cause said improvement to be made in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this ordinance.

Section 3. That said sum of \$7,100.00 so deposited by said J. L. Davis, as hereinabove recited, is hereby appropriated from said general fund, and the sum of \$1551.00 is hereby appropriated from the water fund for the installation of said water service lines.

Section 4. This ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said road is impassible and is in need of immediate improvement, for which reason this ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
