## ORDINANCE NO. 16-38

By Mr. Stackhouse:

Appropriating money for the payment of that portion not to be borne by the Works Progress Administration and not to be specially assessed of the cost of improving the alleys as provided in Resolution No. 5-38, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BENLEY, OHIO

Section 1. That to pay the remaining portion of the cost of the improvement of the various alleys provided in Resolution No. 5-38, adopted April 12, 1958, which portion is not to be borne by the Works Progress Administration or specially assessed, but which shall be thereunder payable by the City, there is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$6000.00.

Section 2. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said alleys are in an impassible condition and dangerous to public traffic and are in need of immediate repair, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
