To vacate that part of the first alley north of Charles Street which lies between Cassingham Road and Montrose Avenue.

Whereas, on the 15th day of August, 1938 a petition and consent of all persons owning all the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon that part of the first alley north of Charles Street which lies between Cassingham Road and Montrose Avenue was duly presented to council praying that said alley between said points be vacated as provided in Section 3727 of the General Code, and further requesting and consenting that if said petition be granted the City reserve for itself, the public and quasi public corporations, now or hereafter holding franchises and permits from the City for the supplying of water, gas, electricity, telephone service, all necessary easements in, under and over said part of said alley for the purpose of sewers, mains, poles, wires and conduits and maintaining and keeping them in repair so far as the City may deem it to be necessary to supply its inhabitants with public utility service, sewers and drains, and

Whereas, Council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for and that such vacation will not be detrimental to the general interests and finds that said petition and consent have been signed by all of the owners of lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said alley between said points, NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That that part of the first alley north of Charles Street which lies between Cassingham Road and Montrose Avenue in the City of Bexley, be and the same is hereby vacated; reserving, however, for the City, and the public and quasi-public corporations, new or hereafter holding franchises and permits from the City for the supplying of water, gas, electricity, telephone service, all necessary eastments in, under and over

said part of said alley for the purpose of sewers, mains, poles, wires and conduits and maintaining and keeping them in repair so far as the City may deem it to be necessary to supply its inhabitants with public utility service, sewers and drains.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
