Providing for special police, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That in addition to the officers and patrolmen provided for in Ordinance No. 93-31 and Ordinance No. 5-33, the Mayor, with the confirmation of council, may appoint not to exceed five (5) special police for terms of not more than one year. Said appointments may be made from the heads of administrative departments, or their assistants or employees. Said special police shall arrest and detain any person or persons found violating a law of this state, or ordinance of the city, until a warrant can be obtained; shall assist in the suppression of riots or disturbances of the peace, but shall not be required to perform patrol duty, nor shall they wear patrolmens' uniforms.

Said special police shall not receive any salary for their duties as such officers, and shall not be required to give bond.

Section 2. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that at this season of the year there are many violations of the peace, resulting in the destruction of public and private property, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
