

## RESOLUTION NO. 6-39

Declaring it necessary to improve Remington Road from Main Street to Fair Avenue by grading and paving the roadway thereof, constructing curbs and gutters, water connections and the necessary drains, and constructing sidewalks on each side thereof, in cooperation with the Work Projects Administration, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEAVER, STATE OF OHIO: Three-fourths of all members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. That it is necessary to improve Remington Road from Main Street to Fair Avenue by grading and paving the roadway thereof with concrete foundation, with bituminous concrete surface, constructing concrete curbs and gutters, water connections and the necessary drains to furnish proper drainage for said improvement, and constructing sidewalks on each side thereof, in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles of the proposed improvement heretofore prepared by the engineers and now on file in the office of the Mayor, which plans, specifications, estimates and profiles are hereby approved.

Section 2. That whereas, the Work Projects Administration of the Public Works of the United States has proposed and agreed to furnish all labor in the making of said improvement and a portion of the materials necessary therefor, and to make and perform said improvement, on condition that the City of Beaver shall furnish the balance of said materials and equipment and other direct costs, including engineering services, in accordance with the Works Progress Administration Form No. 301, now on file with the Mayor, said improvement shall be made in cooperation with said Work Projects Administration, or other governmental agency, in accordance with said proposal and agreement.

Section 3. That the grade of said street and curbs as improved shall be as shown by the engineers' plans and profiles, which are made a part hereof, and which are on file in the office of the Mayor.

Section 4. The entire cost of said improvement, less that portion thereof which is to be performed and borne by said Work Projects Administration, or other governmental agency, shall be paid as follows:- Two-thirds thereof, exclusive of the cost of water connections, (said two-thirds being in excess of 1/50th of said cost and the cost of intersections) shall be paid by the City of Bexley, and one-third thereof, together with the cost of said water connections, shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: all lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said proposed improvement, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefitted by said improvement, in an amount not less than the cost thereof, and the cost of said improvement shall include the expense of the preliminary and other surveys, and of the printing and publishing of notices, resolutions and ordinances required, the serving of said notices, the cost of construction, together with interest on notes and bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments, and of all other necessary expenditures, as provided in said proposal and agreement of said Work Projects Administration.

Section 5. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five annual installments with interest on deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be issued in anticipation of the collection thereof, provided that the owner of any property assessed may at his option pay such assessment in cash within thirty days after the passage of the assessing ordinance.

Section 6. That the bonds of the City of Bexley shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments by installments and in an amount equal thereto, and notes of said city shall be issued in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds.

Section 7. This resolution is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace,

health and safety, said emergency being that said street is in a condition dangerous to public traffic and should be immediately improved, and said resolution shall go into immediate force and effect.

**NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT**  
Margaret N. Hartford, residing at 424 Corriences, Buenos Aires, South America; Alfred and Elsie H. Gregg, residing at Whiting Corp., Harve, Ill.; Isabel K. Stevens, residing at 2604 Sherwood Rd., and all other property owners abutting upon Remington Road between Main Street and Fair Avenue in the City of Bexley, Ohio, are hereby notified that on the 11th day of July, 1939, the Council of the City of Bexley, Ohio, adopted Resolution No. 6-38, declaring it necessary to improve Remington Road from Main Street to Fair Avenue, by grading and paving the roadway thereof with concrete foundation, with bituminous concrete surface, constructing concrete curbs and gutters, water connections, and necessary drains and constructing sidewalks on each side thereof, in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles of said improvement prepared by the engineers and on file in the office of the Mayor, said improvement to be made in co-operation with the Work Projects Administration of the United States, which said Work Projects Administration is to furnish all labor in the making of said improvement and a portion of the materials necessary therefor, and is to perform said improvement at his own expense on condition that the City of Bexley shall furnish the balance of said material and equipment and other direct costs, including engineering services, the cost to said city being estimated at the sum of \$10,000.00.

Said resolution provides that the entire cost of said improvement, less that portion which is to be performed and borne by said Work Projects Administration, or other governmental agency, shall be paid as follows: Two-thirds thereof, exclusive of the cost of water connections, shall be paid by the City of Bexley, and one-third thereof, together with the cost of said water connections, shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from the improvement upon all lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said proposed improvement, and shall be payable in cash within thirty days after the passage of the assessing ordinance, or in five annual installments.

You are further notified that it is proposed to change the grade of said street, as shown on said plans.
