ORDINANCE NO. 37-39

By Mr. Stackhouse

Providing for the appointment of additional patrolmen, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That council may hereafter from time to time authorize the appointment by the Mayor of patrolmen in addition to those patrolmen provided for in Ordinance No. 3-33, amending Section 3 a of Ordinance No. 93-31, establishing administrative departments for the City of Bexley, passed January 24, 1933. Such patrolmen shall be appointed by the Mayor from lists submitted by the Civil Service Commission in accordance with the law, and shall perform the duties and shall receive the salaries provided in said Ordinance No. 3-33.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that it is necessary that an additional patrolman be appointed at this time, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
