ORLINANCE NO. 49-39 Per 10-55 Dedicarre

By Mr. Stackhouse

To regulate the sale and serving of food for consumption out of doors during the night season.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, partnership, association or corporation, being the owner, proprietor, lessee, person in charge, or employee, of any restaurant, lunch stand, store, or other place of business, between the hours of 11:30 o'clock p.m. and 6 c'clock a.m., of the following morn ing, to sell or serve, or cause to be sold or served, any food, drink or confection, intended to be consumed on the premises of such restaurant, lunch stand, store, or other place of business, outside the building or buildings wherein the business of such sealer is a nducted, or on the streats or public ways adjacent thereto.

Section 2. Any person, firm, partnership, association of corporation who biolates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than \$10.00, nor more than \$50.00, together with the costs of prosecution.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
