Authorizing the purchase of an automobile for the Department of Safety, and declaring an emergency. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be and hereby are authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase of one automobile for use of the Safety Department being a two-door sedan, with standard equipment, two wind-shield wipers and a heavy duty generator and battery adaptable to Police Cruiser work, with spare wheel, same to cost not in excess of \$1200.00 and to exchange thereon one Harley Davidson Motor Cycle, Mfg. No. 30-V, engine No. 11025C, twin, Model 30.

Section 2. Said contract shall be entered into with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement had according to law. The sum of \$1200.00 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund for the purpose aforesaid.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency measure and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public speace health and safety, said emergency being that the Department of Safety is in immediate need of said automobile for street patroling purposes, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
