

ORDINANCE NO. 11-40

Providing for letting of contracts for materials for the construction of pavement, curbing and gutters on Francis Avenue from Mound Street to Livingston Avenue.

Whereas, by Ordinance No. 9-38, determining to proceed with the improvement of Francis Avenue from Mound Street to Livingston Avenue, it was provided that it was necessary, after the fills had been made and said grading had been constructed and the underground services installed, sufficient time should be allowed for the settling thereof before proceeding with the rest of said improvement, and it was further provided that the letting of a contract for the construction of the curbing, gutters and pavement should be deferred until further determination of council, and

Whereas, said fills and grading have been completed and said underground services installed, and sufficient time has elapsed to allow for the settling thereof, NOW,
THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be, and they are hereby authorized to proceed, after advertisement according to law, to let the necessary contract or contracts for the materials for the construction of said curbing, gutters and pavement, and to cause said work to be done in cooperation with the Work Projects Administration, and in accordance with the legislation heretofore passed with reference thereto.

Section 2. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said street is in an impassible condition and should be immediately improved, for which reason said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
