

ORDINANCE NO. 30-40

Authorizing payment of claim of Brown's Motor Service, 2836 East Main Street.

Whereas, on or about February 22nd, 1940, while the Superintendent of Parks was removing a tree at

, in the City of Bexley, the same was permitted to fall and damage the Chevrolet automobile belonging to Dr. Earl A. Hessenauer to the extent of \$40.00, and

Whereas, the said Dr. Earl A. Hessenauer, through no negligence of his own, has suffered damage to his said automobile by reason of said accident in the reasonable sum of \$40.00, and has caused said automobile to be repaired by Brown's Motor Service at the request of the City of Bexley, which said Brown's Motor Service has charged said repair to the City of Bexley, and the said Dr. Earl A. Hessenauer has in writing absolved the City of Bexley from all claims for damage by reason of said accident, NOW,

THEREFORE:


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:


Section 1. That said bill of Brown's Motor Service in said sum of \$40.00 for repair of damage to said Chevrolet automobile belonging to Dr. Earl A. Hessenauer be recognized as a legal obligation of the City of Bexley, and that the same be paid.

Section 2. That for the purpose of paying said claim, there be and hereby is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$40.00.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


