ORDINANCE NO. 49-40

Authorizing purchase of automobile for the use of Safety Department, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BENDEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they hereby are authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase of one automobile, being a two door Sedan, with standard equipment, having two windshield wipers, heavy duty generator and battery adaptable to police cruiser work, and spare wheel, same not to exceed \$1000.00 in price; and to exchange thereon one Chevrolet two door sedan, Engine Number ______, with all equipment thereon excepting radio, spot light, fire extinguisher ______

The bidder shall transfer all of the above equipment to the new car except the radio, which shall be taken care of by the City, the cost thereof to be included in the bid, and the City shall transfer said radio.

Section 2. Said contract shall be entered into with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement had according to law. The sum of \$1000.00 is hereby appropriated from the general fund for the purpose aforesaid.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that the Safety Department is in immediate need of said automobile for street patroling purposes, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
