RESOLUTION NO. 5-41

Declaring it necessary to improve Maryland Avenue from Cassady Road to Stanwood Road, by grading and paving the roadway thereof with concrete base and bituminous concrete surface, constructing concrete curbs and gutters and necessary drains to provide drainage for said improvement and constructing sidewelks on each side thereof, in cooperation with the Work Projects Administration, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEY, STATE OF OHIO: Three-fourths of all members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. That it is necessary to improve Maryland Avenue from Cassady Road to Stanwood Road, by grading and paving the roadway thereof with concrete base and bituminous concrete surface, con structing concrete curbs and gutters and necessary drains to provide drainage for said improvement and constructing sidewalks on each side thereof, and doing all things incident and necessary thereto, in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles of the proposed improvement heretofore prepared by the engineers and now on file in the office of the Mayor, which plans, specifications, estimates and profiles are hereby approved.

Section 2. That whereas, the Work Projects Administration of the United States has proposed and agreed to furnish all labor in the making of said improvement and a portion of the materials necessary therefor, and to make and perform said improvement, on condition that the City of Eexley shall furnish the balance of said materials and equipment and other direct costs, including engineering services, in accordance with the W. P. A. Form No. 301, now on file in the office of the Mayor, said improvement shall be made in cooperation with said Work Projects Administration, or other governmental agency, in accordance with said proposal and agreement.

Section 3. That the grade of said street and curbs as

improved shall be as shown by the engineers' plans and profiles, which are made a part hereof, and which are on file in the office of the Mayor.

Section 4. That the cost of said improvement, less that portion thereof which is to be performed and borne by said Work Projects Administration, or other governmental agency, shall be paid as follows: Two-thirds (2/3rds) thereof shall be paid by the City of Bexley (said two-thirds being in excess of 1/50th of said cost and the cost of intersections), and onethird thereof shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said proposed improvement, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefitted by said improvement, in an amount not less than the cost thereof, and the cost of said improvement shall include the expense of the preliminary and other surveys, and of the printing and publishing of notices, resolutions and ordinances required, the serving of said notices, the cost of construction, together with interest on notes and bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments, and of all other necessary expenditures.

Section 5. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five annual installments with interest on deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be issued in anticipation of the collection thereof, provided that the owner of any property assessed may at his option pay such assessment in cash within thirty days after the passage of the assessing ordinance.

Section 6. That the bonds of the City of Bexley, shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments by installments and in an amount equal thereto, and notes of said city shall be issued in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds.

Section 7. This resolution is an emergency measure,

necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said street is in a condition dangerous to public traffic and should be immediately improved, and said resolution shall go into immediate force and effect.

Tamarind Street, Compton, California, and all other owners of property abutting upon Maryland Avenue between Cassady Road and Stanwood Road, Bexley, Ohio, are hereby notified that on the 11th day of February, 1941, the council of the City of Bexley, Ohio, adopted Resolution No. 5-41, declaring it necessary to improve Maryland Avenue from Cassady Road to Statwood Road, by grading and paying the roadway thereof with concrete base and bituminous concrete surface, constructing concrete curbs and gutters, and necessary drains to provide drainage for said improvement, and constructing sidewalks on each side thereof, in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles of said proposed improvement, prepared by the engineers, and on file in the office of the Mayor, said improvement to be made in co-operation with the Work Projects Administration of the United States, or other governmental agency, which said Work Projects Administration is to furnish all labor in the making of said improvement, and a portion of the materials necessary therefor, and is to perferm said improvement at its own expense, on condition that the City of Bexley shall furnish the balance of said materials and equipment and other direct costs.

Said resolution provides that the entire cost of said improvement, less that portion thereof which it to be performed and borne by said Work Projects Administration, or other governmental agency, shall be paid as follows: Two-thirds thereof shall be paid by the City of Bexley and one-third thereof shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from the improvement upon all lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said proposed improvement and shall be payable in cash within thirty days after the passage of the assessing ordinance, or in five annual installments, with interest on deferred payments at the same rate as shall be before by the bonds to be issued in anticip Notice of Street insprivement
