ORDINANCE NO. 10-41

OHIO:

Authorizing the purchase of two trucks for the Service Department, and declaring an emergency. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they hereby are authorized to enter into a contract or contracts for the purchase of two automobile trucks with combination bodies suitable for the collection of rubbish or garbage, and having such equipment and specifications as they may deem best suitable for said purpose, the same not to exceed \$2100.00 each, or a total of \$4200.00, in cost; and to exchange thereon the following trucks, to-wit: one 1936 Chevrolet truck with dump body, Motor Number T6160129, and one 1933 Dodge truck, Motor Number T2-5623.

Section 2. Said contract or contracts shall be entered into with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement had according to law. The sum of \$4200.00 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund for said purpose.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that there is immediate need for the use thereof in the collection of rubbish and garbage, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
