

ORDINANCE NO. 41-41

Amending Ordinance No. 621, commonly known as the Building Code, so as to provide for partition walls in wooden, frame, double and multiple dwellings, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 621 establishing a building code, be amended by adding thereto Section 19 -a, as follows:

Section 19-a. That in all wooden frame double or multiple dwelling houses hereafter erected in the City, a partition wall, as defined in Section 19, paragraph 30, of said Ordinance, shall be constructed between the separate living units of such building or buildings.

Section 2. This ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that such partition walls are necessary against fire hazards in buildings about to be erected, and the same shall go into immediate force and effect.
