

ORDINANCE NO. 46-41

By Mr. Harlor

to authorize the purchase of a portable compressor for the use of the Department of Public Service, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEALEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they are hereby authorized to enter into a contract, after advertisement according to law, for the purchase of one gasoline operated portable compressor of capacity capable of delivering a minimum of 105 cubic feet of air per minute, the same to be equipped with necessary Buster, two tampers, hose, joints, and other necessary tools, and to cost not to exceed \$2700.00, the same to be for the use of the Department of Public Service for street maintenance and repair.

Section 2. That the sum of \$2700.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated from the Streets Maintenance and Repair Gasoline tax Fund.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace and safety, said emergency being that certain streets in the city are becoming dangerous to traffic and in need of repair, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
