

ORDINANCE NO. 50-41

Providing for the resurfacing and repairing of certain asphaltic streets, roads and avenues in the City of Bexley, Ohio, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:


Section 1. That whereas, Sheridan Avenue from Livingston Avenue to Main Street, Remington Road from Livingston Avenue to Main Street, Remington Road from Elm Avenue to Maryland Avenue, and certain parts of other streets in the City of Bexley, are in need of repair so that the same may be maintained as proper highways, said streets, roads and avenues shall be repaired by resurfacing the same in part with asphaltic pavement and surface treating the same in part, and repairing the base, curbs and gutters thereof, in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles thereof prepared by the engineers and on file in the office of the Mayor, and which are hereby approved.

Section 2. That the entire cost of said repairs shall be paid the City, and the sum of \$19,300.00 is hereby appropriated from General Fund for the purpose of paying the cost thereof.

Section 3. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they are hereby authorized and directed to enter into contracts for said repairs after advertisement according to law.

Section 4. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance, and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, by reason of the fact that said streets are fast deteriorating and becoming unsafe for traffic, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
