

ORDINANCE NO. 59-41

Authorizing the purchase of a motorcycle for the Department of Public Safety, and declaring an emergency.


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:


Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they hereby are authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase of one motorcycle with such specifications and accessories as may by the Mayor be deemed necessary for the use of the Department of Public Safety, the same to cost not more than \$800.00

Section 2. That the sum of \$800.00 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund for the above purpose.


Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that the Police Department is without sufficient motor vehicles for patrolling purposes and the same shall go into immediate force and effect.
