BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COURTE OF THE CITY OF BELLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they hereby are authorized and directed, after advertisement according to law, to enter into contracts for the purchase of gasoline for the use of the trucks and automobiles belonging to the municipality during the calendar year 1943 in the approximate amount of 20,000 gallons, said gasoline to conform to the specifications set forth and adopted in Ordinance No. 11-36. Award of the entire amount may be made to one bidder and contract entered into therefor, or awards may be made for portions thereof to different bidders and separate contracts entered into for the respective amounts so awarded. Delivery shall be on order of the Mayor and shall be in tank on City property.

Section 2. That the sum of \$4,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund for the purpose of paying the cost of said gasoline.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said gasoline is necessary for the present operation of various city departments, and this ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
