

RESOLUTION NO. 2-43

Refusing leave of absence to Chief of Police.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BERLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. THAT, WHEREAS, Ralph A. Hammar, heretofore serving as Chief of Police, did on or about the 8th day of January, 1943, volunteer for service in the military services of the United States, as a captain in the Military Police, and upon entering into said military services requested a leave of absence as such Chief of Police, and

WHEREAS, by reason of the uncertainty of the length of time of such military service, the said Ralph A. Hammar will necessarily be absent from the City for an indeterminate period of time, and Council is of the opinion that the best interest of the Police Department, and of the City require that such leave of absence be not granted, such leave is accordingly hereby refused; and it is recommended to the Mayor that he declare the office of Chief of Police vacant, and that he may take such action relative to the filling of such vacancy as he deems to be to the best interests of the City.

Section 2. That this resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
