

ORDINANCE NO. 4-43

By Mr. Altmaier

Providing for the office of acting chief of police.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the office of acting chief of police is hereby created, which position shall be exempt from the classified service. Such acting chief of police shall have and exercise the powers and duties provided for the chief of police by the charter and ordinances of the City, and by the general laws not in conflict with the charter, during the absence or incapacity of the chief of police, or in case of a vacancy in said office. Such appointment shall be by the Mayor, and the term thereof shall be at his pleasure, and if such appointment shall be made from the Police Department, the same being temporary, shall not be deemed to be in the nature of a promotion, and shall not affect the civil service status of such appointee.

Section 2. The salary of the acting chief of police shall be at the rate of \$210.00 per month, payable semi-monthly.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and the same shall go into immediate force and effect.
