Authorizing the purchase of \$50,000.00 of United States of America, 7/8% Treasury Certificates of Indebtedness, Series B, due April 1st, 1944.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That whereas, there are moneys in the Treasury of the City which will not be required to be used by the City for a period of six months, or more, the Mayor, the City Solicitor and the Auditor are hereby authorized, upon submission by the Auditor to the Mayor and City Solicitor of a statement of the moneys in the Trecoury, or in the process of collection, and a schedule showing the probable requirements of money for the use of the municipality for such period not less than six months, together with a recommendation as to whether the sum of \$50,000.00 in the Treasury shall be invested in such obligations, the Mayor, City Solicitor and Auditor be and they are hereby authorized to invest said sum of \$50,000.00, plus any accruals of interest, in United States of America, 7/8% Treasury Certificates of Indebtedness, Series B, due April 1st, 1944, at a price not to exceed the current market value of such bonds and accrued interest, and the sum of \$ 50000 is nereby appropriated for that purpose,

Section 2. This ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace and safety, said emergency being that said certificates of indebtedness are being used by the United States Government for the prosecution of the War, and this ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
