

Ordinance No. 21-43

Providing for the purchase of automobile for use of Police Department, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they are hereby authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase of one new two-door sedan, with standard equipment, two windshield wipers, heavy duty generator adaptable to police cruiser work; heavy duty battery to operate radio and other equipment; spare wheel; heater; spot lights and rear compartment or trunk space to accommodate Red Cross equipment, the same to cost not to exceed \$1200.00, and to exchange thereon one Hudson two-door sedan, engine No. 1012517.

Section 2. Said contract shall be entered into with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement had according to law. The sum of \$1200.00 is hereby appropriated from the Safety Fund for the purpose aforesaid.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said Police Department is in need of said automobile for patrol duty, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
