

ORDINANCE NO. 10-44 :

By Mr. Altmaier

Providing for pay for extra time for certain police officers hereinafter named.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Whereas during the months of February and March, 1944, in order to meet an emergency growing out of an unusual number of burglaries committed in the City, the following officers devoted the number of hours, set opposite their respective names, beyond the regular hours of employment, to the solution of said burglaries and the apprehension of the parties committing the same, to-wit:

Officer Bradfield	29 Hrs.
Officer Stebelton	7 1/2 Hrs.
Officer McElfresh	17 1/2 Hrs.
Officer Reeb	14 Hrs.
Officer Kuhn	4 1/2 Hrs.
Officer Snoots	1 1/2 Hrs.
Officer Haering	4 Hrs.
Officer Tyack	1 Hrs.

AND WHEREAS, said officers were specially assigned to said work after hours, and were promised compensation therefor, it is hereby ordered and ordained that they be paid for such services at the same rate per hour as provided by their regular salaries, based upon an 8-hour day schedule, and the Auditor is authorized to issue his voucher in payment thereof.

The sum of \$75.00 is hereby appropriated from Safety Fund for the above purpose.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
