Fixing a charge for tapping into and using sanitary sewer in Sanitary Sewer District No. 5.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. WHEREAS by Ordinance Me. 3-44 Council determined that the entire cost of constructing an 8 inch sanitary sewer in Sanitary Sewer District No. 5, being an 8 inch sanitary sewer in Delmar Drive extending from the end of the present sewer, a distance of 205 feet in Delmar Drive, should be paid out of the general fund, and that a proper charge should thereafter be fixed by Council for the privilege of connecting with and using said sewer, which said charge should be paid by the respective owners of the properties bounding and abutting upon said sever at the time of tapping into the same, Council does hereby fix a charge of \$50.00 as a proper charge for the privilege of connecting each lot bounding and abutting thereon, and using said sewer, said charge to be considered in the nature of a fee for a permit for so connecting with, and a rental charge for using said sewer, the same to be paid by said abutting owners at the time of securing a permit to tap into said sewer. Said charge when so collected, shall be paid into the City Treasury to the credit of the general fund.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
