

ORDINANCE NO. 12-44

By Mr. Harlor

Prohibiting the keeping open of automobile salesrooms on Sunday.

Be IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to keep open, within the City of Bexley, any automobile salesroom for the purpose of doing business, or to display for the purpose of sale or trade on the streets or sidewalks of said City or in or on any lot or other place in said City, any automobile on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday.

Section 2. Any person violating the provision of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars, and shall pay the costs of prosecution.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
