ORDINANCE NO. 16-44 ·

Authorizing the Mayor and Auditor to enter into a contract on behalf of the City of Bexley with the City of Columbus, Ohio, for furnishing Bexley with fire protection, and declaring an emergency.

Thereas, the contract with the City of Columbus, Ohio, to furnish fire protection to the City of Bexley expired on the Slst day of December, 1943, and it is deemed to be for the best interests of said respective municipalities that a contract shall be entered into with said City of Columbus, for the furnishing of fire protection for a further period of five years beginning the 1st day of January, 1944 and ending on the Slst day of December, 1948, MOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor of the City of Bexley be, and they are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with the City of Columbus, Ohio, for the furnishing of rire protection by said City of Columbus to the City of Bexley, and the inhabitants thereof, for the period of five years beginning January 1st, 1944 and ending December 31st, 1948, on the following terms and conditions: That said City of Columbus is to answer fire calls from said City of Bexley and its inhabitants and to send fire apparatus and firemen thereto for the purpose of extinguishing fires in said City of Bewley, Ohio, in like manner as fire calls are answered and fires extinguished in the City of Columbus, the said City of Benley to pay therefor for the year 1944, \$16,250.00; for the year 1945, \$16,250.00; for the year 1946, \$16,250.00; for the year 1947, \$16,250.00; and for the year 1948, \$16,250.00, the amounts in each of said years to be paid in equal semi-annual installments on or before January 15, 1944 (or upon the execution of said agreement) and July 15, 1944; January 15, 1945 and July 15 1945; January 15, 1946 and July 15, 1946; January 15, 1947 and July 15, 1947; January 15, 1948 and July 15, 1948. Provided,

however, that in no case shall the City of Columbus be liable in damages to said City of Berley, or any of its inhabitants, for failure to answer any fire call or for lack of speed in answering any such call, or for any inadequacy of equipment, negligent operation of apparatus, failure to entinguish any fire, or for any cause whatsoever growing out of such agreement and such use of the fire equipment and personnel of said City of Columbus. Said contract shall also provide that either party thereto may cancel and terminate said contract at any time before the expiration thereof by filing a ninety day written notice with the opposite party of its intention so to do.

Section 2. That the sum of \$16,250.00 is hereby appropriated for the payments falling due under said agreement for the year 1944; and the Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to issue proper vouchers for the amounts becoming due under said contract as the respective payments thereunder become due and payable.

Section 5. This ordinance is an emergency measure and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said city is in the need of immediate fire protection, for which reason this ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
