

ORDINANCE NO. 18-44

Authorizing the Recreation Board to employ supervisors for the summer of 1944 and appropriating money therefor, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Whereas, the Recreation Board has reported to this Council that the Board of Education of the Bexley City School District has indicated to it its desire to join with the city and said Recreation Board to set up and administer a minimum program for the recreation period of twelve weeks during the summer season of 1944, making its school grounds available for that purpose, and to furnish certain equipment, supplies and labor, and whereas, it was suggested in said proposal that until the services of a full time Recreational Director are made available, the Recreation Board employ and pay the salary of the following supervisors, to-wit: One head supervisor at a salary of \$37.50 per week; three woman supervisors at a salary of \$25.00 each per week, and one man supervisor at \$35.00 per week, all of whom shall be teachers in the Bexley Schools, and that it purchase certain supplies and equipment estimated to cost approximately \$168.20, and that it furnish certain labor, and whereas, Council is of the opinion that said program should be gotten under way at once and carried on during said twelve weeks of the summer season, the Recreation Board is hereby authorized to employ said supervisors hereinabove listed at the salaries above stated, the same to be employed from the teaching force of the Bexley Schools, and to purchase and supply equipment at the above approximate cost and to conduct said recreational program on the school properties designated by the Board of Education.

Whereas, said supervisors are to be teachers in the Bexley Schools and said recreational program is to be operated jointly by the City and the Board of Education of the Bexley School

District, and Council is of the opinion that said teachers are qualified for said positions and said work is temporary and seasonal, said positions shall be exempt from the classified service.

Section 2. The sum of \$2,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund for the foregoing purposes.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and said ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon the passage thereof.
